wrapped up 2023 by
celebrating "100 years
of happy" as a city taxsupported library. The
library has truly come a long

way since 1923. Gone are the days of quiet and being shushed as WPL today is a strong, robust community hub for all to collaborate, create, learn, discover, grow, and make noise! It makes my heart happy to see how people use the library in many different ways. I am proud to report that 384,284 people used the library and 1,133,243 items were checked out in 2023. This Annual Report will highlight data and showcase how the library was used, in-house and virtually.

While library usage grew, so did the WPL's community engagement. I always say that **Public Libraries + Community Partnerships = Success!** Below are some of the successes we had in 2023:

- WPL celebrated the Andy Warhol Portfolios: A Life in Pop / Works from the Bank of America Collection, presented by the Cleve Carney Museum of Art and the McAninch Arts Center at the College of DuPage, by displaying four prominent Wheaton faces on the Library's west plaza windows: Glennette Tilley Turner, Jonathon Blanchard, Marget Hamilton, and Jim Belushi.
- The library's west plaza hosted three dinosaurs as part of the Downtown Wheaton Association's Dinos Downtown Wheaton exhibit that brought 10 life-sized animatronic dinosaurs to Downtown Wheaton.
- The Wheaton Chamber of Commerce and WPL sparked great collaboration and learning with Ignite which consists of monthly business, career, and lifelong learning programs.
- Over 200 people donned their favorite plaid and enjoyed 18 holes of wacky, fun mini-golf at the WPL and Wheaton Park District Mad Fore Plaid fundraiser.

• A Butterfly Donor Wall was installed on the lower level. This new donor wall added another opportunity for donors to give to the WPL Endowment, which is managed by the DuPage Foundation. I am pleased to say 2024 will be an exciting year with the library moving forward to repair and enhance the west plaza as well as working towards planning projects to enhance the main floor, youth, teen, and tech spaces. 




